I find moving very exciting and one of my favourite moves was coming to Mostar 11 years ago in 2010. Way back in 1994 – single and 22 years old – I was praying to God that he would bring me to Bosnia and Herzegovina to serve but he didn't. However, fast forward 16 years and I was on a plane – with my wife Liz and our two children, Gabrielle and Ben – coming into land at Dubrovnik airport, where we were picked up by Ivica. He drove us to Mostar and a new adventure began.

One reflection I have is that God called us all here, not just me. He has used Gabrielle and Ben to shine his light at school, in sports, amongst peers, even when they were just 8 and 6. Don't discount the little ones. And that's what Novi Most is all about - what will God do in young lives? Novi Most at its best is as good as it gets at partnering with local churches and helping young people discover more about themselves and God. So many here say that the best times in their lives were Novi Most moments. You're part of that through your kind support. Thanks.

It's time for us to move on from Novi Most, though we'll still be in Mostar. Moving forward our new brief will involve more multi-generational work that focuses on serving across the life of the church, getting involved in formal education through working with both teachers and pupils, and personal evangelism in our local community. YOUTH CAMP

Emek Beraka, the campsite owned by the Evangelical Church in Bosnia and Herzegovina, hosted various camps this summer. The biggest was Youth Camp, which gathered young people from across the region.

"For me the highlight of the summer was definitely camps, even if we were afraid of having camps because of corona and how the situation is currently in the country. So first of all it means a lot that we were able to have some camps, and second it was special that we had around 70 young people at Youth Camp. The highlight of that camp was that on the last night four young people came forward to accept Jesus in to their lives. And there were many who didn't come forward who renewed their relationship with God. I felt that it wasn't just an emotional reaction or response to how we shared the gospel. It was really obvious that these young people want to follow Jesus from now on, they want to live a different life."



ROYAL RANGERS CAMP



Still happy after having to cook for themselves

"First of all I want to thank God for protecting us and for working in the hearts of young people. The theme of the Royal Rangers' camp this year was 'Storms'. There were young people from all over the country - Sarajevo, Tuzla, Jajce, Prijedor, Brčko and Mostar. We took 12 young people and three leaders from Mostar. These 12 young people are a part of Novi Most through Royal Rangers.

I have to say that it really encouraged me that these young people took responsibility and successfully completed their tasks. For most of our young people it was their first time at camp, although three of them had been scouts. It was the first time for them sleeping in tents and cooking for themselves and what they made was really tasty. They didn't only surprise us but they were surprised themselves. Their parents were so happy when they heard this. We also had workshops such as archery, running, tying knots, pampering and pyrography. For the evening programme we gathered around the camp fire and shared about God from his word.

On the last evening we had an evangelistic talk where after the word young people could raise their hands if they wanted prayer for the storms they are going through in their lives. For me it was really encouraging that four young people from Mostar raised their hands and asked for prayer and we could pray with them.

And of course as well as taking part in all these activities the young people made new friends with young people from other towns. I believe this is just the start of what God will do in the lives of these young people and in us leaders."

Each year at Emek Berak there is a 'full-time team' the people who are at all the camps to make sure everything is set up properly and runs smoothly. Many of the team are late-teens and twenties. Beki explains how this is a training opportunity.

"We had a retreat for the full-time team, who worked at Emek Beraka camps. I can see how they are growing and maturing. They want to serve and they feel more ready and equipped from year to year. All of this is part of our vision at Novi Most. We want to equip and encourage them to keep being part of a change in society. With the skills and self-confidence they get from their time serving at camp they can transform the places where they live."

With no big Teen Camp this year the Capljina team organised a Mini Camp for some of their teenagers.

"We did the mini camp for our teenagers in Čapljina knowing they wouldn't be able to come to Youth Camp. What I noticed is it made them really appreciate camp more, they noticed how much work goes into the setup, especially the people who'd been on camp their whole lives."

"The theme of the camp was 'I can't be bothered'. Most of them on the camp were teenagers and this is a very teenage attitude: I can't be bothered. Where does that attitude lead you? If you can't be bothered you won't go anywhere, try anything or see anything. I told them that it was great they could be bothered enough to come on the camp. That's a good first step. We did some great work together - there was a lot of grass cutting and cleaning - but we also had a lot of fun. For a few of them it was their first time on the camp, and they were excited about it. I hope they'll want to come back next year."

"This summer we have focused on young people in 7th-9th grade. It has been great to see a new group forming and we are excited about what will happen with this group in the future. We had weekly activities such as tennis, volleyball, barbecues and board games sessions, and one-off events including a concert, an escape room, a treasure hunt and a ukulele workshop. We had planned for the concert to be outside but out of all the lovely summer days we have had, on this day it poured with rain so we had to fit everyone into the church for the concert. Twenty young people performed so with all the parents watching it was very squashed but the atmosphere was great and the response from the audience was very positive."



A NEW GENERATION OF MUSICIANS IN TOWN

Rowan is the conductor of Limena Glazba, the town wind band, in Jajce. The band was founded 123 years ago and last conductor held the post for 50 years. When she took over the need for new, enthusiastic players was obvious. It's the conductor's job to teach young people who want to join, so she's been teaching half a dozen different brass and woodwind instruments. Now a new generation is emerging. This summer she had the opportunity to take six teenagers to a Limena Glazba camp in Stolac. Over four days of workshops and rehearsals her band members learned fifteen new songs and got to perform a concert with other musicians from around the country. Many of the band's new young members are also connected with Novi Most activities. We are glad to be able to provide such a wide range of musical opportunities to young people in the local community.
