

In February we held two Winter Camps on Jahorina, one of the Olympic mountains outside Sarajevo. The first camp was for teenagers, held over a long weekend, the second, for students and twenty-somethings was mid-week. Both camps were a huge success, not just in how well people learned to snowboard but also in the new friendships that were formed and how everyone was engaged with what happened in the programme.

We begin our round-up of Winter Camp feedback with Ivica, from Čapljina.

"Before I came to faith my perception of being a Christian was of a boring person who is praying all day in his room and just being miserable his whole life. Boy was I wrong! Winter camp is one of those moments in a year I'm really excited about, not just for the fact that I'll be on the mountain snowboarding, but the fact that we can spend time with young people who would realistically probably never have a chance to try snowboarding. It's amazing how much you can compare learning how to snowboard to everyday life and especially faith in God. It helps you think about how to have (self) confidence and who to trust."

The theme of the second camp was "(Self) Confidence". The challenge was for us to think about what we put our confidence in. On the last night of the camp Novi Most intern Angela shared her experience. It was the end of a week where she had tried snowboarding for the first time. She was grateful for Budo's help and instruction, and for the picture of God's care for us she'd got through the learning process.

"When I get on a snowboard, I know that there is someone who will help me. For me that was Budo. It is really positive that when we fall, even in our weaknesses, there is someone who will always help us. He will always be that person, when it's bad and when it's good. Even in our strengths, when we see some moments of victory – like when Budo let me go alone and when I managed to put into practice what he had been working on with me for two hours – God was also there and supported me."

Hi, my name is Phil. I'm involved in the Christian Action Sports Network, which is a network of skaters, surfers and parkour athletes who love Jesus. So I was planning to come down to Sarajevo, for planning meetings and to go snowboarding, and I was thinking I bet there are some people in the Action Sports Network that want to come. I knew SFC had sent some people so I reached out to them. Stefan Burri, who's been to a number of these camps, said if you're going down there try and time it so you can help out with one of the winter camps. All I knew is it was a Christian camp for young people. I got given Beki's number and said "we'd love to help".

When we got here I discovered it was a Novi Most camp! I remember years ago being at Spring Harvest, I was in the youth meeting and they were taking up an offering for a couple to start a youth ministry in BiH. That was Nikola Škrinjarić and his wife. I remember putting in my couple of quid. I didn't think about it much until some years later, when I came to visit YWAM in Sarajevo. I remember hearing about Novi Most so we went down to Mostar to visit. Now to discover there's also Novi Most in Capljina and Sarajevo and Jajce, it's just super encouraging to think that something I heard about more than twenty years ago has grown into something where there are active youth projects in four cities. One of the takeaways of this time is realising Novi Most probably plays one of the key roles in Christian youth work here in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Phil's connection to Novi Most goes right back to the very beginning!







RIJEKA USRED POŽARA - AN EXCITING NEW SONG!

At the beginning of February we released a song called "Rijeka usred požara", written during a songwriting workshop at Youth Camp last summer. Matt produced the track and was able to involve almost half of those who had been in the workshop in the recording.

"I'm so happy we had this opportunity. It's important to make things. Producing a song like this is a practical way of showing that change is possible. The fact the three singers are from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Serbia makes a statement. It is just one bit of evidence of a new level of connection we see developing between young believers, which is massively encouraging."

We've had really good feedback about the song. There is a real sense of ownership of it from those who were at Youth Camp. We hope that it is just the first of many projects like this. Angela, who was a singer and songwriter on the Izvor Života EP, gave us her reaction.

"I can't stop listening to the song – it's so good! God has really spoken to me through the song, and I feel like the lyrics are much deeper than they seem. I'm really impressed by the fact that the youth from all around the region managed to create something like that. It's inspiring and empowering. It's also motivating me to be involved in future projects."

Ivica explains, "The event started with a short breakfast followed by worship then prayer for unbelievers. Rock, Seed and Clay were our theme of the event. We prayed that 'rock' solid hearts would soften, for every 'seed' of the Good News to fall on good soil and bear fruit, and for the 'clay' – the local Christians – that God would shape them and there would be unity in Jesus Christ. It was a grey and rainy day but that didn't stop people doing a prayer walk around the town!"
