When asked about a recent highlight, Budo couldn't resist sharing, "You know, it all started quite spontaneously, we had organised this hiking event from the town to the lake. It's not just any hike; it's a journey filled with exploration, laughter, and bonding. We walk around, soak in nature, and just have fun together."

The excitement in his voice was palpable as he recounted the experiences, especially highlighting the joy it brought to the young people. "But kids, oh, the kids really enjoy it. Especially John," He said with a chuckle. "John was really excited. I didn't think he would be keen on coming, you know, but he surprised us all. And boy, can he eat! He's a funny kid, truly." How Baking is connecting our young people in Mostar

At the heart of our vibrant tapestry of youth programmes lies a simple yet profound philosophy: the best way to serve our young people is by listening to their voices and turning their aspirations into reality. This ethos has not only shaped our journey but has also painted our efforts with strokes of creativity, warmth, and inclusivity. It all began with a conversation, a spark ignited by the curiosity and desires of a few young girls. They approached Indria with a simple yet heartfelt request, "Can you teach us to cook? We don't get the chance to do it at home." In this moment, a new chapter of our journey unfolded. Indria, embodying our ethos of listening and creating, embraced this request with open arms. What started as a small cooking group has now flourished into a thriving community. This isn't just a place where recipes are exchanged; it's a sanctuary where life's lessons are shared, where discussions about faith and the future are as common as the flour on their aprons, and where every session promises a delicious treat.

However, our dreams are as vast as the flavours we wish to explore. Our current resources, including the absence of an oven and limited cooking equipment, have not dampened our spirits, but they have curtailed our culinary adventures. We dream of the day when we can experiment with recipes that require baking and beyond. Imagine the possibilities - the joy of pulling a perfectly golden loaf of bread from the oven, the excitement of decorating cookies for a community event, or the warmth of sharing a freshly baked pie. Strengthening trust through the arts

Over the last 3 months, in her role as leader of Jajce town wind band, Rowan has been involved in a project called 'Možemo bolje' or "We can do better" This project has been funded by the European Union. Over the last 18 months the project was started in 24 local communities in BiH, with the aim of strengthening trust and cohesion and one of these local communities is Jajce.

In Jajce 'Hrvatski Napredak', the Croatian cultural society, was the lead organisation for the project which took the form of setting up an amateur theatre company open to people of all ages and backgrounds. Together this group of people wrote an original play called 'Please don't block my sun'. The play follows 5 characters as they go through the process of learning to stand up for what is right and to go against the pressures to conform even when they are rejected for it. Rowan was asked to write the music for the play and to organise a small orchestra to play the music for the performances. The orchestra was made up of young people from the Jajce town wind band and violin students from Novi Most.



'We have now performed the play in Jajce, Travnik, Sarajevo and Gornji Vakuf/Uskoplje and we have invitations to perform in several more places. Over 500 people came to our first performance and many have told us how the message of the play impacted them and left them thinking about it for a few days afterwards. Some were even moved to tears. By working together on this project the actors and musicians have got to know people they would not have otherwise met and have made new friendships with people from different age groups and backgrounds.'
